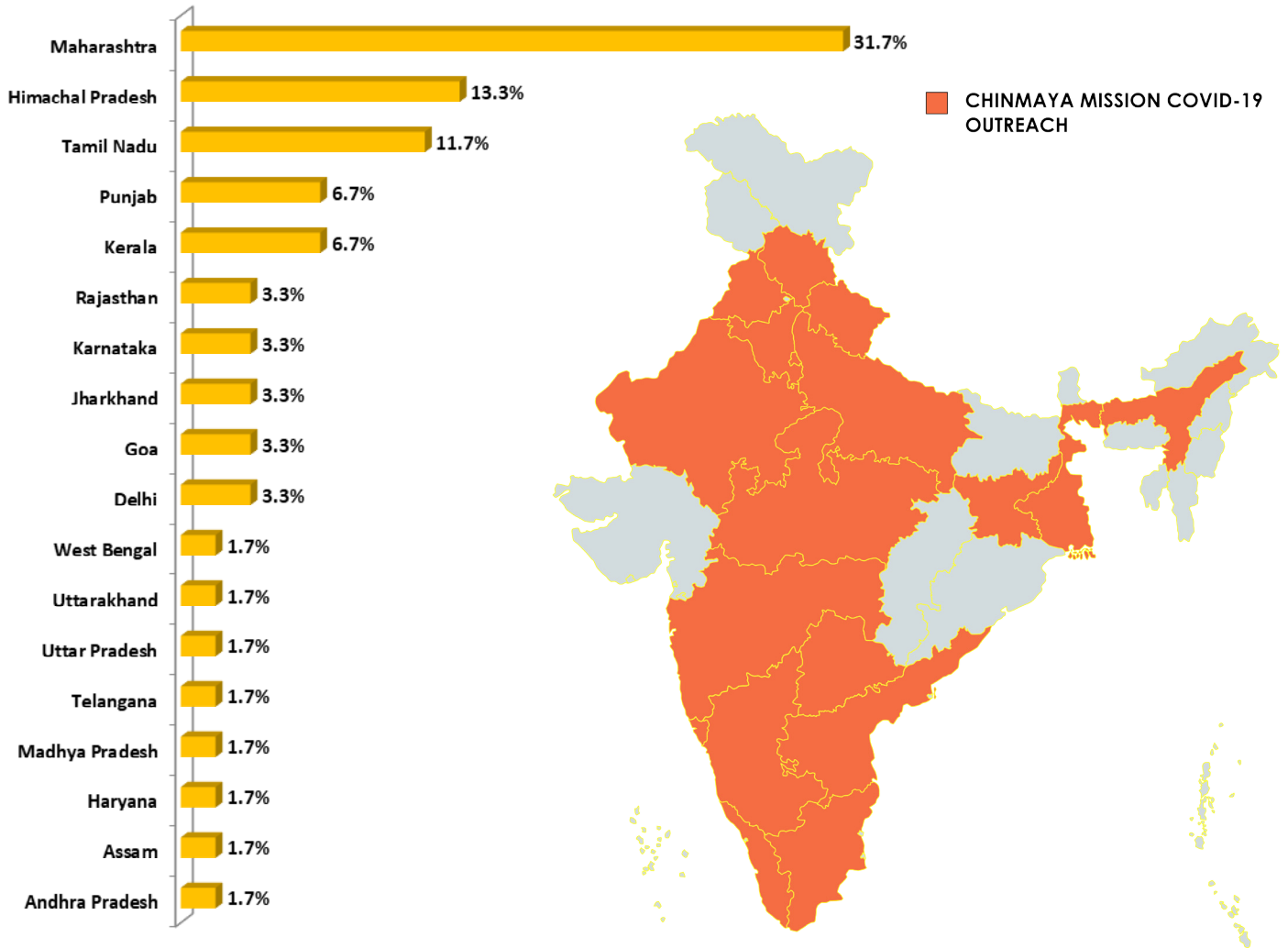

Glimpses of Support Work Facilitated by CCMT:



Chinmaya Mission donated 2 body para monitors (7 functions are simultaneously monitored) to Wadia Hospital for Children at Sewree, Mumbai, Maharashtra. This hospital has a capacity of 512 beds and has been upgrading its COVID-19 ward as per government directive. These monitors will be of use even in the future.



The Medical Superintendent of Dr. Rajendra Prasad Government Medical College, Kangra at Tanda, Himachal Pradesh, received 10 oxygen concentrators donated by Chinmaya Mission as part of 'Each One Reach One' COVID-19 relief efforts.



An oxygen concentrator was donated by Chinmaya Mission to Uma Sanjeevani Hospital, Gurugram, Haryana.



Chinmaya Mission donated 10 oxygen concentrators (10L) to Government Hospital, Noida, Uttar Pradesh.



CCMT donated 1 ventilator each to the following 3 upcoming COVID-19 centres in the Konkan region of Maharashtra:

CCMT handed over 5 oxygen concentrators to the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Kangra, at Dharamshala, Himachal Pradesh.



Inspired by Swami Swaroopananda's call – Each One Reach One – Shri Vicki Bedi of Bedi Foundation, New Delhi, has to date single-handedly raised the funds to donate 72 oxygen concentrators to 6 hospitals and 19 PHCs located in Punjab (Gurdaspur, Batala, Dhariwal), Himachal Pradesh (Dharamshala, Palampur), Rajasthan (Jaisalmer, Barmer), Uttarakhand (Chaukuthia) and New Delhi (Malviya Nagar and Mustafabad).
